## SUPPLEMENTAL FORMS | FORM 8B – PAST TAX DEBT

You **MUST** provide a copy of each of the below requested documents.

- Documentation Confirming Resolution of Tax Debt:** Provide the letter or other document you received from the tax authority confirming that this account has been fully paid or otherwise has a zero balance (such as through a paid settlement). If you do not have any documentation, attempt to obtain a letter or other document from the tax authority showing the same. If this is an IRS debt, you may be able to avoid delays in the processing of your application by promptly requesting IRS Account Transcripts (not Return Transcripts or tax returns). If the relevant tax year(s) are recent, at least four years of Account Transcripts can usually be downloaded from the IRS website or requested by mail. Obtaining older Account Transcripts requires [Form 4506-T](https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript) and processing time for the IRS. Additional information can be found at:
